Application procedures	 Eligibility: Ensure students meet the academic and language proficiency requirements set by both universities. Application: Students should submit necessary documents which are required by the partner university. Selection: Both universities review applications and select students based on academic performance, personal statement, and availability of spaces. Approval & Nomination: The home university approves the selected students and nominates them to the partner university. Visa & Documentation: After acceptance, students apply for a student visa and complete any necessary health insurance or financial proof requirements.

Accommodation

All exchange students will have priority to apply for our university dormitory. Due to limited rooms, students must indicate their accommodation need on the application form.

Please refer to the appendix for detailed information on the residence fee for each room type.

1. Ying-shi

(4-6 students per room)

The basement floor includes kitchens, lounges, and entertainment rooms. The first floor includes a student restaurant. The rooms are located on the second through eighth floors.



2. Da-Yong Shu

(4 students per room)

The basement floor includes student clubs and a recreation center. The fourth and tenth floors are used for study rooms. The third and seventh floors are used for gyms.



3. Shao-Yong Shu

(4 students per room)

This building can offer 158 beds for students, making it the smallest among all of the dorm buildings and it is used only for graduate students.




The basement floor is used for a reading room.

4. Chung Jing Yuan

(6 students per room)

This building can offer 576 beds for students. The lounge is located at the entrance of the first floor. The reading room is located on the basement floor.





5. NTCU Guest House (under renovation)

(1) Double Room	US\$50 per night US\$60 per night

The Guest House offers a total of 25 suites. Each suite includes flat screen monitor TV, internet, dry and wet separation bathroom, refrigerator, and air-conditioner. Guest house also provides meeting rooms, lounges, public kitchens, and laundry machines.



Insurances

<u>General Insurance</u> (for one-semester exchange student)
All exchange students are required to purchase both Overseas Accidental

	Insurance and Overseas Medical Insurance in their home country. Each type of insurance must provide coverage of at least USD \$35,000 and must be valid for the entire exchange period. (If students plan to stay for an academic year, please ask our coordinator for further details.)
Visa	Students whose exchange period is less than 6 months should apply for a Visitor Visa.
